

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL EXHIBITORS:

All exhibitors agree to accept these regulations and any regulations pertaining to a department when entering. Please call (928) 775-8000 or see page 4 of this Premium Book to check dates and times for entries in each department.

1. All exhibits must be prepared to conform with special regulations of the proper department. Agriculture, Horticulture, and Floriculture must be grown by the exhibitor. Any entry (except livestock) that has been previously shown at the Yavapai County Fair shall be disqualified. A "professional" is anyone who sells said item from his home or business and makes 50% or more of his income from said activity. "Junior" or "Youth" is a person 19 years or younger as of the first day of the fair, unless otherwise specified within the department.

2. Entry forms are provided by the Yavapai County Fair if they are required by the department rules. Download and print specific forms from our website (www.YavapaiDownsAtPV.com), or get them from the fairgrounds. Check department regulations for deadlines and specific department entry forms.

EMAIL RULES: In addition to accepting entries at the Fair Office (or other designated locations) we can accept your entries via the Internet. Check with your department(s) to see if they will accept Email entries. The following is required for Email forms:

- A. The form must be Emailed by the due date. If the department requires a payment then the payment must be received in the Fair Office by the due date.
- B. The Fair Office or Superintendent will Email you a confirmation of receipt. Please bring the receipt with you when you bring your exhibit to the fair.
- C. Information as to whether Email entries will be accepted by each department is listed under each Department's page.

3. Every entry shall be entered in the name of the owner and/or the person who created the item.

4. All judges will be selected by the Fair and the awards of the judges will be accepted by entrants. Judges will make no award where, in their opinion, the exhibit is not worthy, regardless of number of exhibits in the Lot or Class. No exhibitor shall interfere in any way, either by making suggestions or arguing with a judge. In any violation of this rule, the exhibitor will be barred from exhibition and will forfeit premiums and entry fees. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the Fair Committee will be final.

5. All exhibitors will be expected to remove their exhibits or make arrangements for removal with the superintendent of the proper department on Sunday, October 3, 2010, **after 4:30 p.m.**

6. THE FAIR WILL TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION TO GIVE PROPER CARE AND PROTECTION OF EXHIBITS BUT WILL NOT ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ANY EXHIBIT OR PERSON. Any property left over two (2) days after closing date of Fair (October 3, 2010) becomes the property of the Yavapai County Fair Association and may be disposed of.

7. Cash premiums will be paid at the premium window on the first floor of grandstand building. All vouchers must be picked up by no later than 3:00 p.m. Sunday October 3, 2010 Vouchers must be cashed no later than 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, October 3, 2010. NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED. Voucher office open during posted hours.

8. FAIR HOURS:

Thursday, Sept. 30, 2010: fair exhibits open at 12:00 p.m. (Noon) and close at 10:00 p.m. that evening.

Friday & Saturday, Oct. 1 & 2, 2010: fair exhibits open at 9:00 a.m. and close at 10:00 p.m.

Sunday, Oct. 3, 2010: fair exhibits open at 9:00 a.m. and close at 4:00 p.m. **(EXHIBITS RELEASED AT 4:30)**

Entertainers, food concessions, and carnival will stay open each night until 10:00 p.m.

Note: None of the above regulations shall be changed without permission of the Fair Committee.
